New Addition To The Marina

Dock Safety

With the upcoming storms, it is important to double check all of your dock lines and fenders to make sure that they are secure. Also, this would be a good time to check to make sure your bilge is clean and your automatic bilge pump is in good working order.

As a little reminder, please make sure that **NO** flammable or combustible materials are stored in your dock box. For prohibited items, please see yellow triangle located on all dock boxes.

Have electrolysis around your boat and don't know why? One reason may be a hanging power cord in the water. Your 30 amp marine grade power cord can cause a hot spot for electrolysis if left in the

water for long periods of time. Please make sure when securing your power cord, that is up and out of the water.

If you see something that seems out of the ordinary while on the docks, take an active role and call a Marina Representative. If one is not available, you can call Sea World Security at **619-226-3800**. It is better to be safe than sorry.

Hey Did You Know...

Tyler Brocklehurst is our Marina Accountant. He works behind the scenes making sure that all of our accounts are up to date and accurate. Although you have never seen Tyler, I know many of you have talked to him about accounting or billing issues over the phone.

In accordance with park policy, payment for a new month's slip fees is due on the last business day of the previous month. For example, February 2009's rent for the month should be paid by January 30th, 2009. If payment is received after the last business day, then you will receive a past due statement.

We know that this has caused some confusion with our tenants in the past. So for those of you who would like a little reminder about your bill, we can email you with a notice when billing time approaches.

The 2009 Tide Books are now available for your convenience.

Beginning Nov. 3 2008 park admission prices have gone up: General admission for adults is now \$65 and Child is \$55.

With that said, starting Jan. 1 2009 you may be able to pick up your 12 half off admission tickets for 2009 in the Marina Office.

Need a little snack? We have candy items and water on sale year round. These items are also available in the Marina Office

Now through Dec. 31, 2009 Sea World Marina tenants can purchase Silver Passports at a reduced rate \$89 for adult and child one-year Passports and \$139 for adult and child two-year Passports.

Boat detail service is available at the Marina, given you have a trailer for your boat. Our service covers hard compounding of the oxidation above the water line, fine finish to remove swirl marks and waxing. Service does not cover inside of cabins. Please see a Marina Representative for more details.
